CLASS OF THE WEEK - CLASS 3:

Class 3 have really enjoyed the second Autumn half term so far and are continuing to amaze Miss Dawson with their creative ideas. We have started a new book in Class 3 – ‘Gregory Cool’ and the children have really enjoyed getting to know Gregory, learning about the Caribbean and beginning to plan and write diary entries. We are excited to complete some art work linked to the book. Last week was anti-bullying week and Class 3 enjoyed a short experiment using washing up liquid to demonstrate how ‘goo’ or ‘unkind words’ can come out of our mouths, but are a lot harder to take back in. This helped us become more aware of how our words can hurt or upset others and how important it is to be kind.

The children are really working hard in their spelling practice, with Year 4 amazing Mrs Pett recently with their knowledge of prefixes, suffixes and sentence building! Class 3 have also enjoyed learning hockey skills during PE, working together in teams and showing fantastic sportsmanship. Class 3 have also set up a Science experiment, involving coloured paper and light. The children are looking to see how UV rays from the sun can affect and damage our bodies – and other things!

Last, but not least, Class 3 have also learnt the skills to now run their own independent class assemblies, in front of their peers and we have all really enjoyed watching them. We have heard and sung beautiful songs, listened to really important prayers and shown respect when listening to one another.
