Unfortunately, afterschool clubs are currently postponed however, we hope to have these up and running again as soon as we can.




CLASS CHAMPIONS

HUGE Congratulations to this week's Class Champions:


Hill Top Class: Marnie, you have tried really hard this week and have kept yourself very busy! You put in a great effort to make some yummy feeders for the birds, well done
