





The SEND Partnership are writing to all families of children with special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND) to ask you to complete our annual survey about your experiences.

The Partnership wants to find out what effect the improvements made so far by the SEND Improvement Programme have had, and what they need to do next to continue to make things better.

There are separate surveys for those whose children have an Education, Health and Care plan (EHCP), those whose children do not have an EHCP and for children and young people themselves. Survey for those whose children and young people HAVE an education, health and care plan (EHCP)

You have until the end of September 2022 to complete the survey. Your feedback will help shape improvements in SEND services and support for the future.
