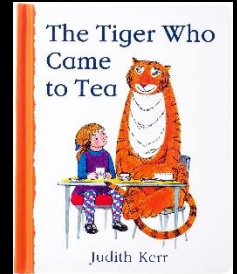
South Lakeland District Council are offering a Sustainable Warmth grant scheme which aims to retrofit eligible properties with energy efficiency measures at no cost to the occupiers. Local authorities in Cumbria have been collectively awarded £20 million of funding for the scheme, and Carlisle City Council will lead the Cumbrian Consortium of Councils, which includes Allerdale, Barrow-in-Furness, Eden, Carlisle, Copeland and South Lakeland.

Eligible properties that have a gas supplied central heating system (known as 'on-gas') may qualify for up to £10,000 of grant funding. Eligible properties that have central heating systems powered by fossil fuels such as coal, oil or LPG (known as 'off-gas') may qualify for up to £25,000 of energy efficiency measures.

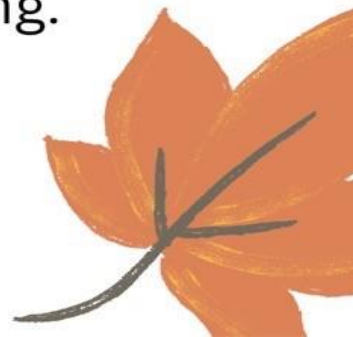

Sustainable Warmth Cumbria Grants

Cumbrian district councils have secured funding to run the Sustainable Warmth scheme, which aims to install energy saving measures into over 1,300 homes across Cumbria.

You could be eligible for a grant up to £25,000 towards insulation and low carbon heating measures, if your household income is below £30,000 and your home has a low energy performance.

The scheme offers a range of energy efficiency improvements such as solid wall and cavity wall insulation, heat pumps, solar panels, underfloor insulation and first-time double glazing.

The grant is even available for private landlords to apply for qualifying tenants with up to £5,000 of funding available.
